For those needing transportation, a bus will transport campers from our central office located at 138-150 Stimson, between Cass and Woodward in Detroit.

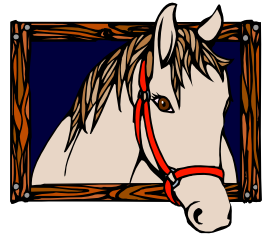

Residential Camp Options

Saddle up your horses...for a week of horsemanship, riding and other summer fun! Daily ground and Western or English riding lessons are supervised and taught according to CHA certification standards. Trail riding is a fun extra! Add Christian friends and counselors, daily devotional times and worship — this may be the best week of your summer. Some camps end by giving your family and friends a taste of the week in a horse show on Friday afternoon. Wildwood Ranch is a non-denominational youth camp owned and operated by the Detroit Rescue Mission Ministries. *Our horse camps fill up quickly, so register early!*

All residential camps will also include opportunities for activities such as swimming, daily devotional quiet time, arts & crafts, nature studies, archery, canoeing, team-building, chapel, climbing wall, ropes course and group games.

Wrangler-In-Training

Ages 13-17

June 19 – 23

\$250 per person

This is a program for riders that already know how to walk, trot and canter and desire to be involved as a “Junior Wrangler” position at camp. Campers will improve their personal riding skills along with intensive instruction in horse management, guiding trail rides and assisting in riding lessons along with leadership skills, Bible lessons, chapels and personal quiet times.

W.I.T. Requirements:

- Serve at least one week of a summer internship as a Junior Wrangler after the week of W.I.T.
- Previous horse experience
- Cowboy or paddock boots

Ages 10-12

June 28 — July 2

\$250 per person

English riding program that teaches horse care along with riding skills. Campers spend at least five hours each day learning horsemanship skills, on and off the horse. Highlights of the week are a trail ride cookout, introduction to bareback riding and gymkhana games. The week concludes with a riding pattern performance open to parents and guests.

Mavericks

Ages 13-15

July 12 - 16

\$250 per person

This is a 2 1/2 hour per day Western equestrian program for teens that introduces new riders to horses and enhances skills for intermediate riders. Campers will learn safety, horse care, equipment and riding skills. Campers will participate in a trail ride cookout.

Buckaroos

Ages 10-12

July 12 - 16

\$250 per person

This is an introduction to horsemanship for first time riders through the intermediate level. Campers will learn safety, basic horse care and riding control at the walk and trot. This 2 1/2 hour per day Western program features a trail ride cookout and lots of fun!

Canter & Post

Ages 13-15

July 5 - 9

\$250 per person

Campers spend at least five hours a day learning about horsemanship and riding. This English style riding program promotes horse care, personal riding skills and equestrian knowledge. Highlights of the week include a trail ride cookout, bareback riding and gymkhana games. The week will conclude with a riding pattern demonstration for all parents and guests.

Trails End Horse Pack Trip

Ages 13-17

August 9 - 13

\$400 per person

Experienced riders spend the week riding on the beautiful Michigan “Rails to Trails” Trail and camping at a rustic base camp site. Riders will travel by horseback on scenic trails each day and return to the camp site each evening. Support staff will accompany the riders for any special needs.
